The Meaning of Marriage

The home is built upon Love, which virtue is best portrayed in the 13th chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. "Love is patient and kind; love is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in the right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends...so faith, hope, love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." (I Cor. 13: 4-13)

The true meaning of marriage is love.

It's not the "ceremony" that's important in a marriage, it's the couple's covenant commitment before God and men.
